

During the colloquium, we hope to provide you with the wonderful atmosphere and special feeling that only ISPA colloquia can create.



Theme and Scientific Program

The theme of the colloquium," Meeting Individual and Community Needs", is a challenge for school psychologists all over the world and will continue to be in the foreseeable future. It reflects the major concerns of both practice and theory.

- What does community and individuality mean in different cultures and societies?
- What does it mean at a single school and in the field of school psychology?
- What direction are we going in?
- What new challenges and possibilities are there for different professionals working toward student welfare?
- How do we share the best practices and research regarding the good results of international school evaluations?
- How can school psychologists and others working with students also work with teachers in order to achieve desired results?

We have invited keynote speakers from Finland, Sweden and USA.

We also want to organize one afternoon symposium for those psychologists working in upper secondary schools (over 16 years of age) and another symposium for sharing the best practices in school psychology from the Nordic countries.

Official language

The official language of the Colloquium is English. Simultaneous translation will not be provided.

Finland

Finland, a member of the European Union since 1995, has about 5.3 million inhabitants and is one of the largest countries in Europe. Finland is a northern country of great beauty and has a distinctive cultural life. The capital of the country is Helsinki. Two-thirds of the area is covered by forest and by over 200,000 lakes. The coastal archipelago with its labyrinth of waterways is unique. Finland has 32 wild and beautiful national parks covering 7,300 square kilometers. The main industries are electronics and other high-tech industries, paper and wood processing, and metal engineering. Tampere

The city was established in 1779 between two lakes on the banks of the Tammerkoski Rapids by King Gustavus III of Sweden and has a long history as a place of traditional industrial production - pulp, paper, textiles, and many other products. Today, the post-industrial Tampere has over 200,000 inhabitants and is a dynamic centre of research, technology, education, culture, sports and business. How to reach Tampere?

Tampere has excellent travel connections - including an international airport - with the rest of Finland, Europe and the world. There are frequent daily airline services via Helsinki, and direct flights from Copenhagen, Stockholm, London, Frankfurt/Hahn and Riga to Tampere Pirkkala Airport. The trip from the Tampere-Pirkkala airport to the Tampere City center takes less than half an hour. Helsinki and Tampere are also connected by regular bus and train services. There is a direct bus connection to Tampere from Helsinki-Vantaa airport. Buses leave at regular intervals at all hours. Trains from the Helsinki railway station to Tampere leave regularly every hour. Finland is also easily accessible by sea. There are frequent ferry services to the coastal cities of Turku and Helsinki.

Colloquium Venue

The Colloquium will be held at Tampere Hall, the largest congress and concert centre in Scandinavia. Tampere Hall is a versatile centre of high quality with the latest technical equipment, a first class restaurant and other services. There are several lecture rooms to meet the requirements of the colloquium. Its modern architecture and works of art make it a sight worth seeing. Tampere Hall is located next to a pleasant park across the university main building and within walking distance from the city centre and most of the colloquium hotels.
